Your request dated November 7, 2017, to implement equivalent security measures to accommodate the removal of fencing to complete a project of placing new piping in the area, has been approved. You shall adhere to the temporary security measures outlined in your request and all other measures contained in your Facility Security Plan (FSP).

This approval will expire on November 30, 2017. You are reminded that any deviation from the approved equivalent security measure requires immediate notification to the Captain of the Port. The temporary equivalent security measure is sensitive security information and must be protected in accordance with Title 49 Code of Federal Regulation 1520.

A copy of this email must be kept with your security plan and made available to Coast Guard personnel upon request.

## Temporary Security Measure Request

November 7, 2017

Per our discussion yesterday, EnLink Midstream, Riverside Plant is requesting a Temporary Security Measure for a small piece of the Security Fencing at the end of our existing Rail Rack (please refer to drawings presented during our meeting yesterday). This fencing must be removed to complete a project of placing new piping in the area.

The fabric ties will be removed, and the fence fabric will be rolled back each day at the beginning of work. Workers will monitor the area throughout the work day, a PTZ camera will be directed towards the area and monitored by control room staff and company employees will increase security rounds during this period to once every two hours. These rounds will be recorded for our records.

At the end of each workday, the fence fabric will be rolled back into place and secured with ties to the posts already in place. During nighttime hours, the fence will be monitored by our control room staff using a PTZ camera that will be positioned to monitor the area at all times. Security rounds will continue at the normal scheduled rate of once every 4 hours.

After the project is complete, the fencing will be moved closer to the end of the rail rack by approximately 20 feet. This will increase the area of our security fencing at the facility. We will ensure that our FSP will be amended after the project and submitted to your office for approval.

We anticipate the project will last for approximately three weeks, around the end of November 2017. Please let me know if this Temporary Security Measure is approved.
